### **Budget Pooling**

## Terminology - Account

- Recall.....
  - In FRS, the 4 digit code used to identify the type of expense is called an object code
  - In Banner it is called an account code
  - This discussion refers often to Account Codes (as in Banner Account codes)

## What is pooling?

 Feature that allows control of the amount of spending that is allowed across multiple Banner account codes within the same Fund Organization combination.

# Why are some accounts pooled and others not?

- Many Banner accounts require stricter control of expenditures.
- Those accounts are not pooled, but rather have strictly enforced line item budgets.

#### What pools are being used in Banner?

- Operating indexes/funds (start with #2)
- Similarities
  - Banner and FRS both use Utilities & Part-time salaries pools
- Differences discretionary spending pools

FRS	<u>Banner</u>
3000 – Equipment pool	73000 – Discretionary Spending pool
3020 – Travel pool	
3040 – Telephone pool	
3050 – General pool	

## Pools for non operating

- For all non-operating index codes/funds
  Code begins with 3 8
- You are using one giant pool

- Combo of the Fund/Org

## Why did we reduce the number of discretionary spending pools?

- In FRS, 25% of all budget transfers are made between these discretionary spending pools.
- This change eliminated the need to make these budget transfers
  - Between the four FRS discretionary spending pools (equipment, travel, telephone, and general).

## How do line item budgets relate to budget pools?

- Budgets can be created against any Banner account code.
- Unpooled
  - If the account code is not pooled, the budget amount against that account code is strictly enforced by the system.
  - Example Salary Professional (61130)
    - Budget = \$100,000
    - Spending capped at \$100,000

Note – please resist the urge to transfer \$3,000 to 61418

### In Banner SSB, How do I tell how much money is available in the pool?

- There are three SSB queries
  - Two do not show pool balances
  - One does

### What other changes are there between FRS pools and Banner pools?

- In FRS, budget money is transferred between pools
  - e.g. from pool 3000 to pool 3020
- In Banner, no transactions are processed against pools
  - In fact, pools are non data entry
  - Only able to process against account codes
